A Major Challenge

Our neighborhood and City continues to be threatened by massive development projects, and one in particular, the Playhouse Plaza project approved by the City Council for the corner of El Molino and Colorado could have a major impact on traffic on our residential streets. This is a massive project that, if built, would certainly have an impact in the form of increased traffic on El Molino.

The City Council's approval for this project is the subject of a law suit. The fact that a project of this nature could be approved in the face of strong resident objections and specific directions to the City as part of the General Plan Update process is an indication the MHNA has to be diligent in its efforts to oppose developments that pose a threat to our neighborhood.

From my perspective, our City is at a tipping point where excessive development could cause us to become like the grid-lock communities of LA's west side. Even without new commercial development, several of our already congested intersections are expected to have their rush hour levels of service decline in the next 12 to 24 months. 
