
Much as we value our traditions we need to recognize that our City is changing in many ways (see page 2). Some of these changes will enhance the quality of life in Pasadena while others appear to be threats. Renovation of the Rose Bowl has made our City more attractive for major concert events that will result in economic development and some additional traffic. Extensive development of apartments and condominiums close to Gold Line stations will result in greater population and, hopefully, won't add significantly to rush hour traffic. Multiple hotel projects will aid convention and tourism activity with economic benefits for the City. The Playhouse District has proposed innovative ideas to create a pedestrian and bike friendly commercial area.

The biggest issue of change that confronts us is the proposed connection of the 710 Freeway via tunnel to the 210 Freeway. Many neighborhood groups including our association are monitoring the status of this project. Metro and Caltrans announced that the expected Environmental Impact Report (EIR) has been delayed until February, 2015. This lengthy delay may reflect major problems with the proposed project and as a neighborhood we need to monitor plan changes that may have a major impact on Madison Heights.

For Madison Heights residents, Sid was also a great neighbor. He was always there for us as a neighborhood and always ready to participate in our association events. His bike riding set an example for all of us to be concerned about our environment and the need to reduce our carbon foot print. Sid and his wife Betsy were always ready to make their home available for local meetings on issues of importance to our neighborhood.

Sid will be remembered as a neighbor who helped make Madison Heights a very special place to live. On behalf of all our residents the Madison Heights Neighborhood Association has made a donation to the Pasadena Community Foundation to honor Sid's legacy.

Neighborhood Change

Have you noticed some changes in our neighborhood? As the housing market appears to be rebounding and construction picks up, it has started to have an impact on our neighborhood. We are seeing challenges to our neighborhood with mansionization, speculation home building, flipping of houses that need renovation. In many instances projects have been sensitive to our neighborhood's mix of architectural styles that have evolved since 1906.

A frightening example of what can happen to our neighborhood is the concrete monstrosity under construction on Los Robles. Several residents raised the issue of this house with Terry Tornek at our Annual Meeting, only to learn that the project was in conformance with building codes.

It is time for residents and our Association to become proactive in order to protect our

architectural heritage. A few suggestions that have been discussed with fellow neighbors are:

- 1. get the City involved to develop various restrictions to control building sizes,
- 2. have MHNA become a Historic District (some sections within the neighborhood have been designated as such),
- 3. or section by section, street by street approach to designate historic areas, lastly perhaps a combination of the aforementioned ideas. Several approaches to contemplate for future architectural designs/renovations that would be within the confines of the existing neighborhood need to be considered.




